CAFE UPDATES

Our hospitality team have been working hard to get the café and huts up and running in time for the warmer weather.

We're pleased to share that we have now taken over all hospitality units on the estate, with everything managed in-house. We now employ over 70 members of staff dedicated to running these units and providing the best possible service for our customers.

The café will continue to serve its menu, offering sandwiches, burgers, soup, and brunch favourites such as avocado on toast. Outside, we'll be serving fish and chips, picnic options, and ice creams from the pop-up stalls at the front.



COACHES ON THE ESTATE

West Wittering Beach is a beautiful, natural space for families and visitors to enjoy. During our busiest times, our focus is on making sure everyone can have a safe, comfortable, and enjoyable experience. After reviewing coach visits and demand during peak periods, we've made a few updates to our coach access arrangements.

Coach visits aren't permitted on weekends, Bank Holidays, or between May and August (inclusive).
With the exception of School Bookings.

At other times of the year, coach parking may be available by prior arrangement, depending on space, with a charge of £250 per coach.

Please note that we don't have facilities for coach drop-off or pick-up at the beach, and coaches aren't able to drop off passengers on site. The nearest public coach parking is available in Chichester. Any vehicles with more than 16 seats are classed as a coach.
